A DIFFICULT CHOICE

Jim North, 33, stopped working two years ago so he could stay home and raise his three children. His wife, Alice, is an executive secretary at an investment bank. They live in Glasgow.

5 “Before our third child was born, we both worked,” says Jim. “But with three small children, there was too much to do, and when the day-care centre¹ near our house closed down, we decided that one of us would have to stop working. Our salaries were about the same, but Alice’s company provided better benefits.”

10 “Was it difficult to quit this job? In a way, it was, because there’s so much unemployment. But I was fed up with my job as a supermarket supervisor. I’ll go back to work in a year or two, when the children are a little older. Of course, now I worry about finding another job.”

15 “But I’m glad I chose to stay with my children. My father was a merchant seaman, so we rarely saw him, and I think he missed a lot. I really enjoy my children and have a lot of fun with them. But it’s been hard to make ends meet. It’s difficult for five people to live off one salary.””

Alice agrees, but she too is pleased with the decision they made.
