Cultural tourism is one of the more solid segments within the wider tourism spectrum.
Thff talk offers a-eritical anthropological reflection on the practices and policies of cultural tourism, broadly defined. First, I give a brief overview of various aspects of cultural tourism that have been addressed by tourism scholars.
Then I zoom in on pressing contemporary issues, challenges as well as opportunities.
I end by offering some venues for future attention and research.

He is co-editor of Tourism Imaginaries (2014, Berghahn) and the Anthropology of Tourism Book Series (Lexington) and author of Envisioning Eden (2010, Berghahn) and numerous peer-reviewed articles and book chapters on tourism. Salazar sits on the editorial boards of, among others, Annals of Tourism Research, Journal of Sustainable Tourism, Journal of Heritage Tourism and International Journal of Tourism Anthropology.

In addition, he is on UNESCO's and UNWTO's official roster of consultants and an expert member of the European Parliament's Committee on Transport and Tourism, the ICOMOS International Cultural Tourism Committee and the UNESCO-UNITWIN Network 'Culture, Tourism and Development'.
